
Step by step guide



What is VE day?

- **VE Day or 'Victory in Europe Day' marks the day towards the end of World War Two (WW2) when fighting against Nazi Germany in Europe came to an end.**
- **On 8th May 1945, Prime Minister Winston Churchill made an announcement on the radio at 3pm that the war in Europe had come to an end, following Germany's surrender the day before.**

 - **Many people were extremely happy that the fighting had stopped and there were big celebrations and street parties.**

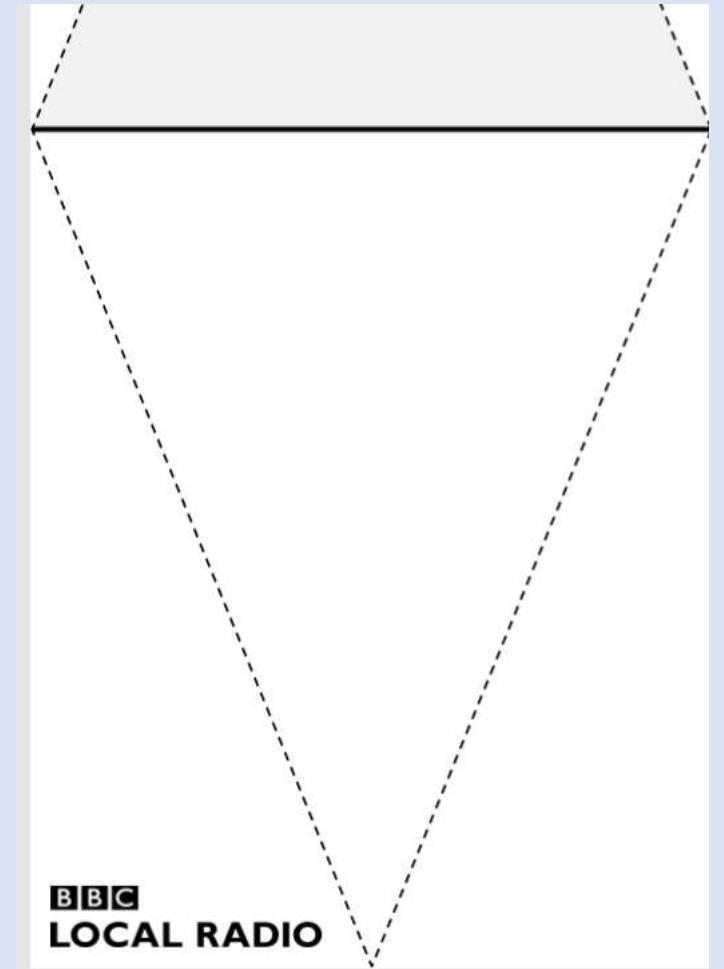

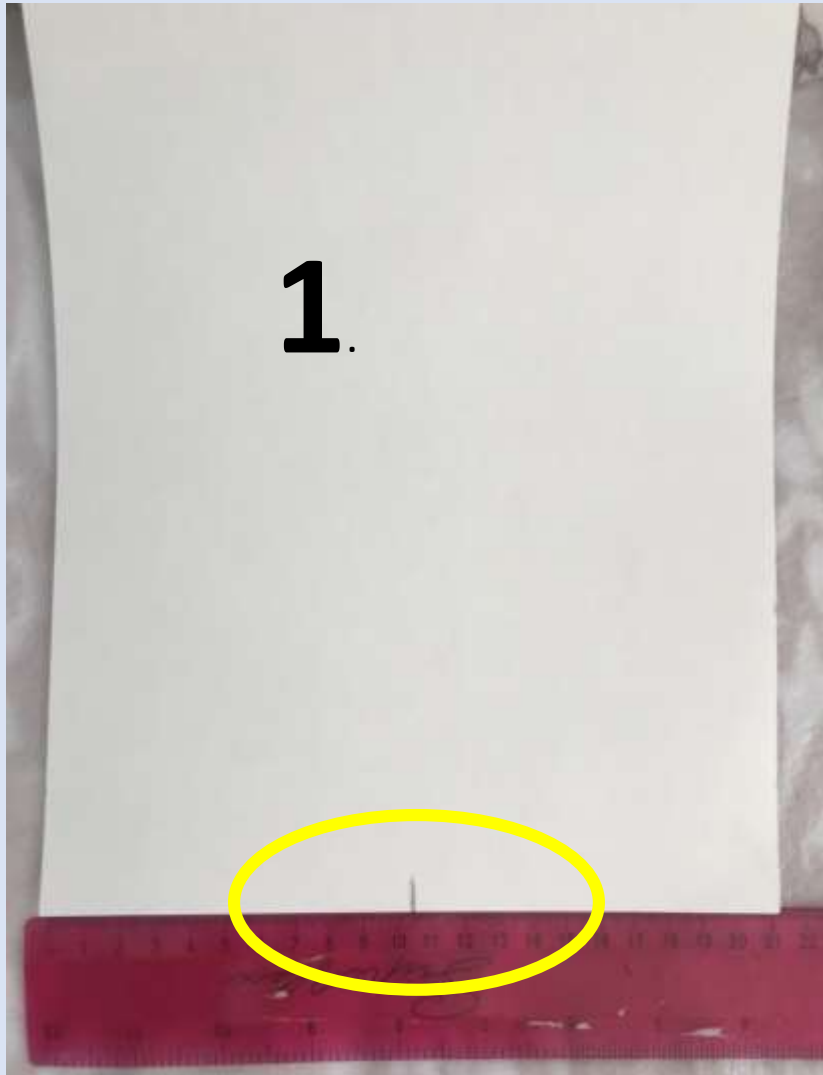
How to get started

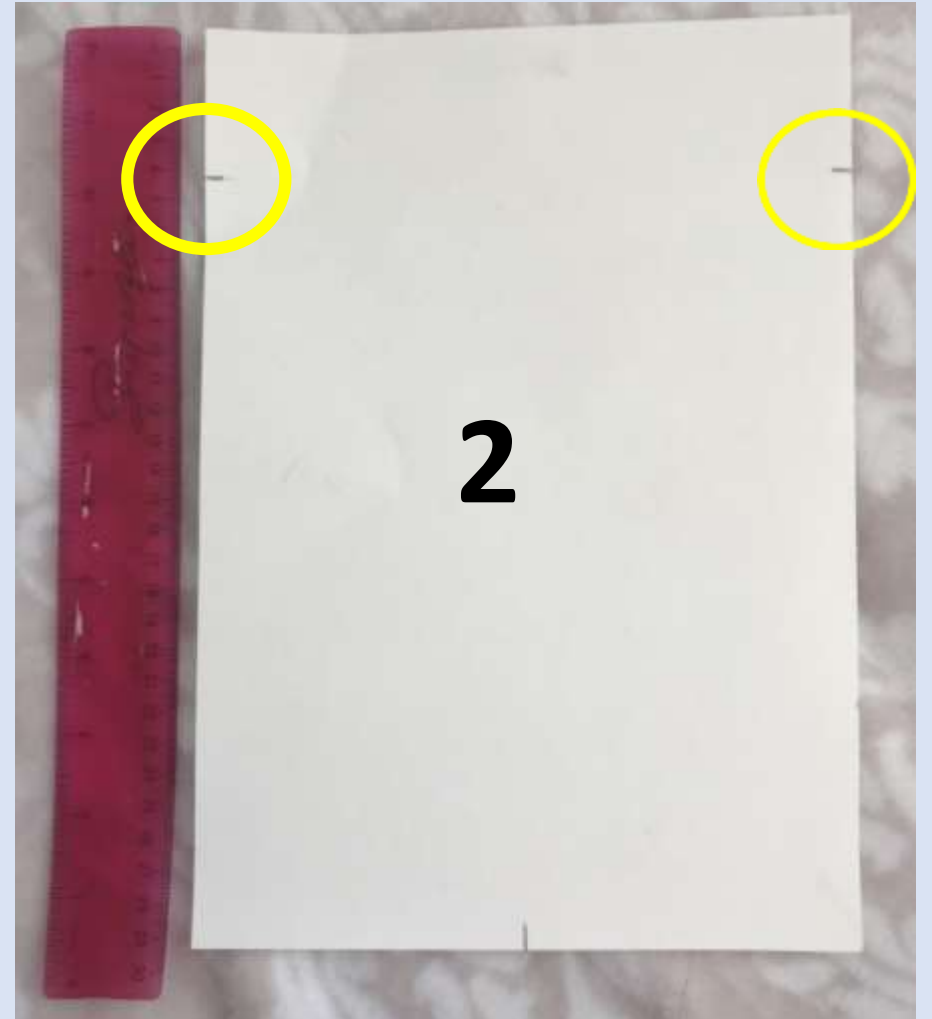

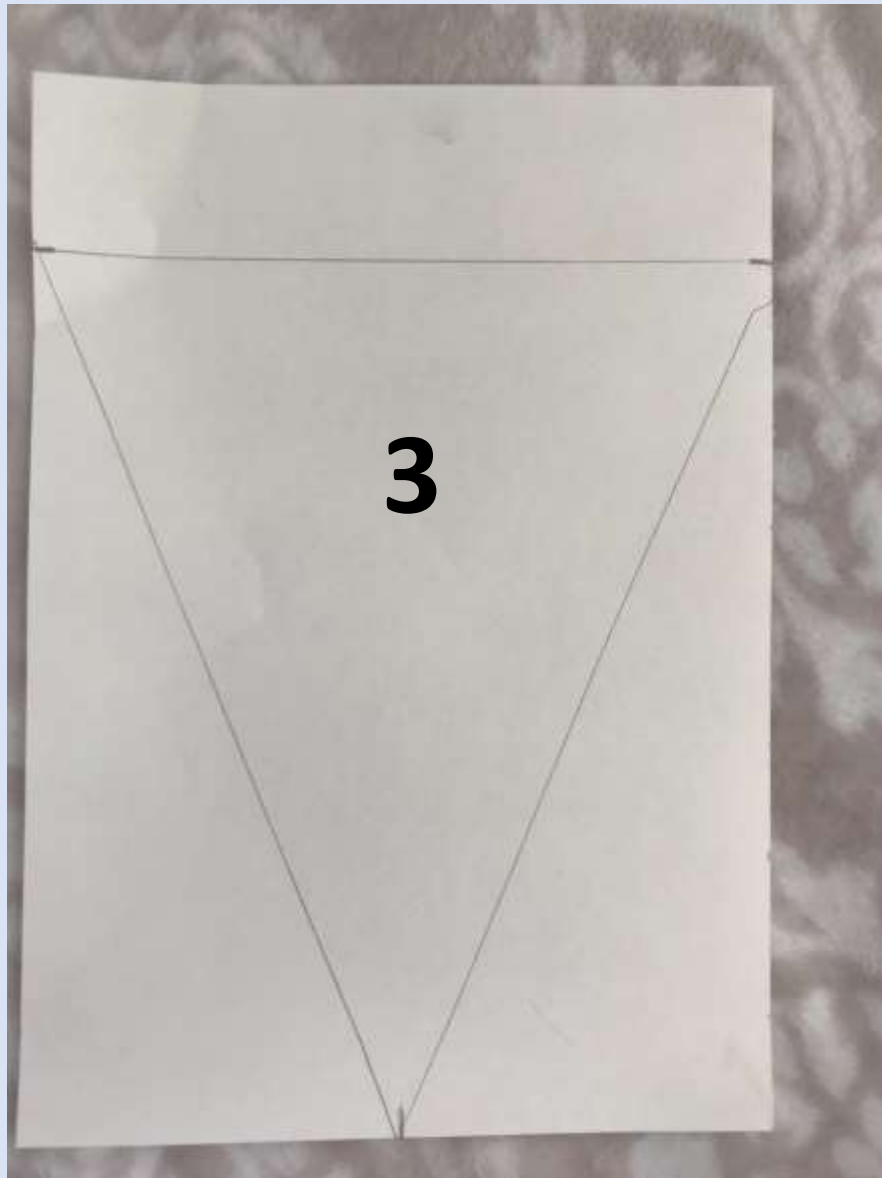
- Lay your paper portrait in front of you.
- Add a pencil line halfway along the bottom of your page. (around 10.5 cm)



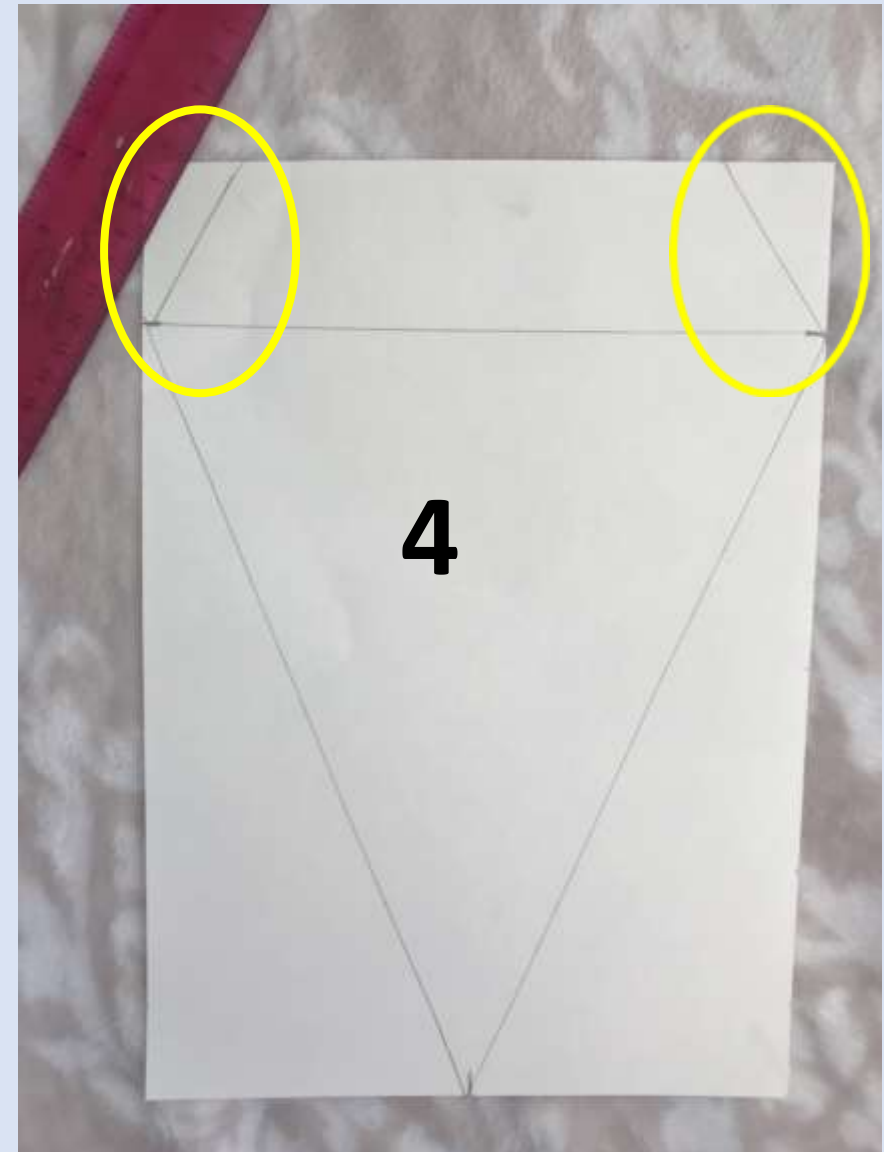
Measure 5 cm down from the top of your page at each side. Make a mark with your pencil.



Join up with a ruler your 3 points



Draw in two diagonal lines from your top two points. Make sure these lines are facing inwards and touch the top of the page.



5. Draw in your design



6. Cut out around the lines neatly

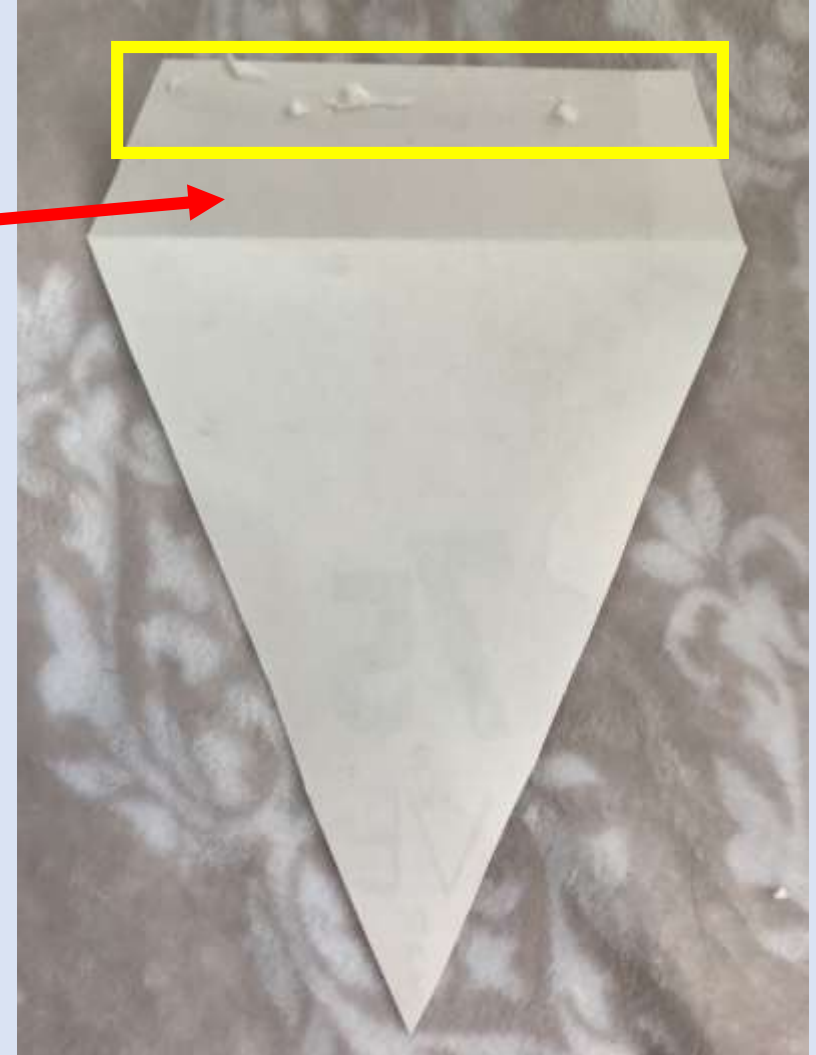


7. Fold along the top line backwards



8. Add glue! Only add the glue along the very edge/top of the paper. You need to leave room for your string/ ribbon to be added through.
