Dear Parent/Carers,

As you will be aware from the Prime Minister's statement on Sunday 10 May, schools will open more widely from Monday 1 June, if the latest scientific advice at this point support it.

The school is hoping to partially reopen to Year 10 students from Monday 8 June. This is a large task and may have some implications on the distance learning support for your children. We will let you know as soon as possible what the significant proposed changes mean for our students and their families.

Year 10 Phased Return to School Update

Thank you to those parents of Year 10 that filled out our recent survey in terms of their child(ren) attending school for revision sessions. I was hoping to write to all Year 10 parents before we broke up for half term to share detailed information regarding your child's possible return in June. Unfortunately, we are not yet in a position to do this. This information will be circulated at some point next week and you will receive a text message when the letter is available to view on the school website. We are really looking forward to welcoming our Year 10 students back, however, I want to assure you that our number one priority remains the health and welfare of staff and students.

Currently, there are no plans for students in other year groups to return to school before September, so it is vitally important for Years 7, 8 and 9 to keep up with distance learning. Please let the school know if your child is struggling with accessing work in any way; we would like to support in any way possible.

I speak for my colleagues as well when I say we are all missing the company of the Hungerhill students.
