Student Additional Information Part 2

Please read this in conjunction with the letter circulated on 27 May and Student Additional Information Part 1 added to the website on 11 June 2020. This letter is also on the school website in the Partial re-opening for Year 10 section.

Distance Learning (as per letter dated 8 June)

During the week of 22nd June, the week prior to the exams, and during the two-week exam period (29th June-13th July) students will not be given any distance learning for any other subjects other than those of the exam subjects. The distance learning they receive should support revision in their exam subjects. The exceptions for this are GCSE and OCR PE, psychology, DT Products and Art and Design who require time for your child to complete coursework in those subjects should they study them.

Students attendance at school

If your child is unable to come into school on their timetable day please notify the school using the normal school procedure with an explanation as we have to report attendance to the DFE daily for those students that have requested to return to school.

Student unwell at home

Member of your household has symptoms

Student unwell in school

What happens if your child becomes unwell at school:

- Precautions are in place to isolate your child and they will be supervised at all times.
- The First Aider should attend the holding room to apply PPE before collecting the student in case this is COVID 19 related.
- The duty SLT member will ring parents/carers to collect their child from school.
- When you arrive, the First Aider will escort the student out of school.
- If your child is displaying COVID19 symptoms, please ensure that your child has a test as soon as practicably possible and request a 24-hr result. This result should be communicated to school immediately by telephone to reception.

If the student tests positive

- Students should isolate at home for 7 days once symptoms have ceased.
- Senior staff will contact all parents of students in that bubble to advise that their son/daughter should remain at home for 14 days.
- The school will contact Public Health England and follow the latest guidance with regards to a 'deep clean' and possibly closure of the school site in order to undertake this.
- Students, parents and carers should be advised to not share this information with other staff or post on social media, this could cause staff stress and anxiety. Please be confident that the senior team will communicate this information through the appropriate channels.
