Dear Parents/Carers,

We appreciate parent/carers are awaiting further information in regards to 'social bubbles' and a timetable for their children. We apologise for the delay, but please rest assured that we are working as quickly as we can and we do appreciate your patience in this matter. We are confident that we will be able to circulate this information by the end of the day tomorrow.

Re: Year 10 Exam Protocols

As you are aware, your child was due to complete their mock examinations this term. Due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, this has not been possible. Upon school closure, your child was sent paper copies of their mock exam papers. Outlined below are the protocols that we would like you to follow so that mock examinations can be completed by your child at home.

- Please see attached an exam timetable for mock exams which will take place in English, Maths, Science and History/Geography. Please be aware that there are two different exam timetables in existence, and this will depend on the social bubble that your child is attached to. It will be made clear which timetable they should follow once the 'social bubble' information has been circulated.
- We would also ask for your support in ensuring that your child does not discuss the content of these papers with other students during this exam block. Unfortunately, due to restricted numbers in school, not all students will be sitting the paper at the same time.
- Face to face lessons and remote learning set from 15th June onwards will support your child through the mock exam process.
- During the week of 22nd June, the week prior to the exams, and during the two-week exam period (29th June-13th July) your child will not be given any distance learning for any other subjects other than those of the exam subjects. This distance learning they receive should support revision in their exam subjects. The exceptions for this are GCSE and OCR PE, psychology, DT Products and Art and Design who require time for your child to complete coursework in those subjects should they study them.
- There will also be a music mock. This will be organised by Miss Crowder and will be coordinated electronically via Teams.
- The mock exam timetable has been constructed over a three-week period. In order to fully maximise face-to-face sessions in school, we have made the decision that mock exams will be conducted at home. We ask that parents fully support their child and the school in ensuring that these are completed in exam conditions as the results of these will help inform future planning to enable teaching staff to address any gaps in learning. During the three-week window, your child has been allocated two exams per day to complete when they are not in school. We would recommend, where possible, someone is able to supervise your child to ensure that they adhere to

exam conditions. We appreciate that parents may be in work, if this is the case we will trust your child's honesty and integrity in this matter.

- We appreciate that none of the above is ideal, however, if your child were to sit these exams in school it would account for the majority of their face-to-face time with staff and we do not feel that this will benefit their learning.
- We also fully appreciate that although your child has been working remotely from home, they will not be as prepared for these exams as they would have been if they had been in school. However, given the Covid-19 crisis, this is unavoidable.
- On completion of the exam, your child should return these the following day when they are due to be in school and place them in the boxes that are provided as they enter the school gates. These will be marked by teaching staff during the six week's holiday. To help with sorting these, please can you ask your child to write their class teacher's name on the top of each paper.
- If your child is not attending face-to-face sessions, we would still like them to complete their exams during this time and we would ask that these are returned to school and placed in the box in the school reception at a time that is convenient, after all exams have been completed. If exams are not returned until September, it will be hard for teaching staff to mark and utilise these for future planning.

Exam Conditions


Your child:

- would benefit from completing exams in an environment where they will not be disturbed.
- should not have access to the internet, mobile phones or textbooks, exercise books, and revision guides.
- should have a clock clearly visible and should make a note of their start and end time, perhaps using an alarm.
- should try to complete the exam in black pen. They will also require a pencil and ruler for science and maths exams.
- should only use a calculator when instructed to do so on the paper.
- can have a drink available.
- should attempt to sit the exam in its entirety and only break if they need the toilet. Otherwise they will be disadvantaged further when they come to sit exams in Year 11.


