
Remember that everyone can improve. It is important for all students to appreciate the need to work consistently hard in order to make progress and to reach their potential. To encourage this mindset in our students we introduced an Attitude to Learning matrix. We make no excuses for 'raising the bar' as far as aspiration, effort and consistent hard work are concerned. Students will be expected to achieve as many 4s 'striving for excellence' and 3s 'motivated for learning' as is possible in all subjects. The Headteacher commends consistently outstanding attitude to learning across a range of subjects. Cases of poor or disappointing attitude to learning are fully investigated.

We are aware that students may be requesting projected Level 2 grades to complete post 16 applications. We have supplied your child's target grades which can be used in an application. Unfortunately, due to COVID, we do not believe that we are in a position, at this time to supply accurate projected grades. Whilst students were asked to complete mock exams during the school closure, these were conducted to allow students to have a mock experience and build exam stamina and for teachers to plan more effectively this term to address gaps in students' learning. Teachers will be assessing students during this half term, to gain a more precise picture of their current performance and we will inform you of your child's attainment and progress as soon as we can. Please be aware that target grades are set at a minimum level called FFT20. They are highly aspirational and nationally 20% of students achieve these. We believe that by setting the bar high, students will rise to the challenge in this important year.

Year 11 students will be sitting mock examinations over a two week period from the 9<sup>th</sup> November. It is important that students continue with the excellent attitude that they have already shown in lessons as well as preparing in advance for these key examinations. In the event of further lockdowns, the grades obtained may be used to inform centre assessed grades.
