Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Whole School Update December 2020

As you are aware, the Government announced yesterday that the return to school for secondary students will be staggered. In line with the guidance, students in Year 7, 8 and 9 will access remote learning the week commencing 4 January 2021. A separate timetable will be circulated later next week. Students in Year 10 and 11 will be expected to attend school to receive face to face lessons, with limited remote learning taking place for these two year groups. Given the amount of lost learning time that a large number of our Year 10 and Year 11 students have lost, we urge parents/carers to ensure they are all in school on Monday 4 January. This will allow for crucial exam preparation:

Year 10 students – Formal Mock Exams week commencing 1 February

Year 11 students - English Mock Exams week commencing 18 January

Actual GCSE Food and Nutrition/Health and Social Exams week commencing 1 February

The guidelines currently state that all students should return to school on Monday 11 January.

We are currently awaiting further guidance from the Government on the mass testing programme. Once this is available, we will investigate this fully. Testing will not be undertaken until we are confident that we have robust plans in place to administer them, along with all parental permissions required to proceed.

As a school we will continue to operate our Track and Trace system up to and including Thursday 24 December. If your child tests positive during this time, please follow the protocols on the school website: https://www.hungerhillschool.com/news/?pid=3&nid=1&storyid=337

Any positive results after this date **do not** need to be communicated to the school during the festive break.

Vulnerable and Critical Worker Provision – Week Commencing 4 January 2021

Vulnerable and critical worker children are able to attend school from Monday 4 January and will be supervised during this time in an ICT suite to complete their learning via Microsoft Teams. Please fill in the following form if you meet these criteria and would like to request a place.

We strongly recommend that students who are classed as vulnerable (Looked After Children and those with an Education Healthcare Plan) take up this provision. The deadline for replies is noon on Wednesday 23 December to allow us to effectively prepare for Monday 4 January.
