Re: Parent View Follow Up

Prior to Christmas we circulated our Parent View survey. Above is a sample of the positive comments that we are very proud to have received and can confirm these have been equally well received by our staff who continue to work incredibly hard to support our young people during these ever-difficult times.

In addition to celebrating areas of school that are working well, the feedback is also used to inform our school improvement planning and prompt further discussion with our Parent Advisory Group. Below are some areas for which further information was requested:

"I have been very disappointed with the out of school activities during 2021." - Following the national lockdown in spring, restrictions remained in place across schools that limited the number of out-of-class opportunities we were able to offer. However, at the start of the new academic year, we relaunched our enrichment programme and currently have over 50 clubs running across lunchtimes and after school. These continue to be well attended, and 69% of the whole school cohort attended either a lunchtime or after school enrichment club last week. The timetable for the Spring activities is attached to this letter.

"I am not aware what level my child is working towards, or at & I have no idea what she is currently learning in each subject." - All parents should have now received the first of our Progress Reports, showing their child's progress in the subjects they are studying, along with an overview of their attitude to learning and attendance. These are sent out electronically and our intention is that such reports will be issued three-times a year. Additionally, each half-term a learning journey for each year group is compiled and published. These documents are sent to the primary contact details that we hold on record and are also available on the school website.

"What do you mean by the term Cultural Capital?" - Cultural Capital refers to the knowledge and skills that a person develops through a range of educational experiences, which demonstrates their cultural awareness. This is developed as students are exposed to and learn about the greatest achievements and













successes within society and from accessing a variety of rich cultural experiences – e.g. trips and visits. This YouTube video provides a good introduction to what this means in reality. https://youtu.be/ET4WodICazk

Other threads that appeared through the feedback from parents:

Behaviour standards – Some parents raised concerns regarding the behaviour standards across school. We approach the two-year anniversary since the start of the pandemic, we are pleased to have school pretty much operating as close to pre-covid times as possible. We continue to respond to a varying degree of student needs and upholding our expectations and standards is paramount in ensuring we re-establish positive routines. Our behaviour policy remains the same and continues to be applied consistently. The full policy can be found on the school website here: download.asp (hungerhillschool.com)

Rewards – Throughout the autumn term we have reviewed our whole-school rewards initiatives. At class level, bonus credits remain available for all students, and these are celebrated each week via our gold star recipients. Additionally, we have placed greater emphasis on promoting and recognising our core values with the introduction of additional achievement points being awarded to students for demonstrating excellence; care and consideration; respect; honesty; resilience. Our postcard system remains in place, and we have also introduced a number of attendance rewards, part of which included the fantastic end of term trip to The Savoy in December. This remains an area that we will always want to develop and is a standing feature with our student council and will be an item for further discussion at our forthcoming PAG meeting.

Communication – Although improvements were acknowledged in the feedback, there is still work to be undertaken in this area as a few parents remain frustrated by the communication streams currently in place. Since the previous survey, we have amended our phone lines and have introduced greater capacity in our reception area to deal with parental contact more effectively. Due to e-safety protocols, we still have a filter on external emails which can limit some making it to their destination. It is therefore encouraged that queries are made via the 'contact us' form available on the school website. The link again is attached here: Hungerhill School - Contact Us

The feedback from parents plays a vital role in our school improvement and we want to thank everyone that takes the time to complete such activities. The more responses we obtain, the more confidence we can have that the findings reflect our whole community.
