Re: World Book Day/Promoting a Love of Reading

At Hungerhill School we believe that reading is a fundamental part of life and a skill which should be developed to support lifelong learning. Our aim is to embed a strong, sustainable reading ethos and culture within our school community, and help students to foster a love of reading through a wide range of rich and diverse texts. We hope to empower students to value their freedom of choice and independence when it comes to reading for enjoyment, and to understand that the experiences gained through reading are unlike any other, as we encourage them to become empathetic global citizens.

As part of our continued focus on fostering a love of reading in our school, we want to take this opportunity to direct you to some helpful resources, and alert you to some exciting events coming up in school.

This week sees an even greater focus on reading across the globe, as we prepare to celebrate World Book Day (WBD) on Thursday 3 March. At Hungerhill, we have a number of initiatives and activities for students to get involved with throughout the week:

- Mrs Ryan, our Curriculum Leader for English, will lead the week's assemblies for all year groups, with a focus on the value of books and stories.
- On Thursday, the library, together with the English department, will be running a number of competitions for students to get involved in, including: a treasure hunt, a reading quiz and 'what shall I read?' bingo.
- There will be a strong focus around school on helping students to select what they would like to read posters around school, recommended reading lists by year group on the school website, a 'prescription service' in the library and links to the WBD online resources to name but a few. This will form part of our rewards system, and will see students collecting 'tokens' to spend at the vending machine. All books have been carefully chosen by staff and so come highly recommended.
