Y11 Assessments

In November of year 11 students begin work on their NEA (Non- Exam Assessment) 2 controlled assessment. This challenge is set by the examination board where they undertake a food preparation and nutrition challenge. Students work independently on this task, and it allows them to research, plan, trial and develop three final products which are produced in a three-hour final practical examination. Folder work records and reflects on the development of this project. This year this comprises of 50% of their final mark. There will be no NEA1 as Ofqual have made the decision to withdraw this element of the course this year due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic.

Following the completion of the second controlled assessment students prepare for the final written examination. The examination lasts for one hour and forty-five minutes and is in two sections. Section A is comprised of 20 multiple choice questions and section B longer response questions. The examination paper covers all aspects of the course specification.
