Dear Parents/Carers,

## Re: Year 11 French Speaking Exam

Your son/daughter's GCSE French speaking exam takes place in the week beginning Monday 25 April 2022 (timetable at the end of this letter\*). This is the second week back after the Easter holidays. This exam counts for 25% of their final GCSE grade. We would like to ask for your support with their revision and we wanted to give some suggestions as to how you can help them.

The speaking exam is in 3 parts:

- 1 Role play (e.g we pretend to be in a cinema. The student is the customer and the teacher is the ticket seller)
- 2 Photo card (students describe what they see in the photo, then discuss the general topic of the photo)
- **3 General conversation** (students are asked sets of questions and answers)

This is what, and how, students should revise for each section.

### 1 Role Play

What: the following key phrases/question words

- 1. avec qui? with who?
- 2. quand? when?
- 3. à quelle heure? at what time?
- 4. où? where?
- 5. combien? how much/many?
- 6. pourquoi? why?
- 7. quel/quelle? which?
- 8. prochain next
- 9. hier yesterday
- 10. quoi what?

How: mind map / flash cards. You could test them on the English meanings of the words.

# 2 Photo Card

What: the following key phrases

- 1. If y a there is / there are
- 2. un homme a man
- 3. une femme a woman
- 4. une fille a girl
- 5. un garçon a boy
- 6. il/elle est he/she is
- 7. il/elle a he/she has
- 8. il / elle porte he/she is wearing
- 9. *il/elle regarde* he/she is watching















- 10. il/elle joue he/she is playing
- 11. parce que c'est because it is
- 12. je suis allé(e) I went
- 13. j'ai regardé I watched
- 14. *je vais jouer* I'm going to play

**How:** mind map / flash cards/ post it notes around the house. You can **test them on the French spellings** and pronunciation of the words.

3 General Conversation – worth half of the total marks! Students can really excel in this part of the exam with thorough revision.

What: their sets of questions and answers from themes 1-3

#### How:

- reading over the answers several times
- writing out the 1st letter of each word and using that to remind them of each sentence
- using pictures to remind them of the key ideas
- listening to a recording of their answers, particularly last thing at night
- The most helpful thing is to practise saying the answers out loud to someone else. It doesn't matter if you don't speak French yourself, you can really help your child by listening to them, and ticking off each word as they say it. You could highlight any words/phrases they miss out, for them to go back over

Additional support for your child's revision is also available in school on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> April. I am running 2 sessions (9-11am and 11.30-1.30pm) which students can attend. During this time, I will support them specifically with revision for the speaking exam. If they would like to attend, please ask them to let me know in advance via email.
