

A Visit from the National Theatre

On Tuesday 8 March, Year 10 students were treated to a visit from the National Theatre, who performed a version of Robert Louis Stevenson's 'The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde'. Our exam hall was transformed into a theatre for the afternoon and allowed students to experience a true visit to the theatre, whilst exploring some of the key themes for their English Literature GCSE. The performance was fantastic, and students thoroughly enjoyed the experience.



The Reading Buddies Programme at Hungerhill

To ensure that all our students have equitable access to the curriculum, Hungerhill School provides a number of interventions to encourage students to read. The Reading Buddies programme is led by our Librarian, Gosia Kwasniewska, and a number of volunteers from Year 9, who support Year 7 students in their reading twice a week in the library. The Year 7s benefit from the one-to-one support and make outstanding progress over the course of the year, often closing the gap in their reading ages and making the expected standard by the end of the year. They begin to read more fluently and develop better comprehension and, also, find a new pleasure in reading. Meanwhile, the Year 9 students develop their leadership skills and benefit from the wonderful contribution to the Hungerhill community.

Online Learning

We installed a digital screen to enhance the learning environment. Students enjoy reading and decoding current posts on French and Spanish Instagram pages. To further enhance their online learning, many students have joined the V-LIT. This is a scheme which provides virtual visits to Spanish/French cities and provides our students with a 'pen-pal' of their own age.

We have also been visited by Madame Crêpe. Our Year 8 and Year 11 students ordered crêpes using their excellent language skills. The Spanish students had the opportunity to practise their speaking skills during our visit to La Fiesta. They enjoyed sampling a wide variety of tapas and writing reviews in Spanish.

Duolingo App

Most recently, we launched the Duolingo app with our Year 7 students. They have responded very enthusiastically! Every Monday, the highest scorers are awarded a prize from Mrs Pond. Some of our Year 8 students are also independently engaging with Duolingo. We have been practising their German in our French lessons!

Further opportunities to reward our students come with our 'Star of the Week' vocabulary league table awards. Weekly winners are awarded the Star of the Week, and it is wonderful to see so many certificates filling our corridor display now. Each half term, prizes are awarded to students who achieve consistently high, or much improved, scores in their vocabulary tests. World Class Schools Update

#WeAreWorldClass

On Thursday 18 March, Mrs Hancock, Mrs Knowles and seven of our Year 11 student leaders went to Houlton School in Rugby for the World Class Schools Assessment Centre with the aim for Hungerhill to be reaccredited as a World Class School. 175 students attended the event from 30 primary and secondary schools applying for the World Class Schools Quality Mark re-accreditation.

This year's assessment centre project that students were given two weeks to prepare for, and a day to complete, was to create innovative, attractive and environmentally friendly outdoor and indoor spaces, incorporating the values of Houlton School. Over 11 project teams, students worked together to design gardens, eco-friendly seating, murals, sculptures and tree hangings, supported by Houlton's staff and partners as industry experts, with advice from a focus group of Houlton's students.

Our students worked really hard with two other schools prior to the event and on the day: they produced an incredible project and we are so proud of them. We are now working on part two of the reaccreditation process which involves our students producing portfolios to demonstrate their World Class characteristics.
