We have two formal mock assessment windows throughout Year 11, where students will complete actual GCSE assessments to identify their strengths and areas for development, as well as provide an indicator of their current working level. These will take place:

- 10 October 2022 – 21 October 2022
- 6 February 2023 – 24 February 2023

Following each assessment window, you will receive a written report updating of your child's progress. Following receipt of this, there will be an opportunity for to meet with your child's subject teachers to discuss their performance and identify what needs to be done to support your child to succeed. 
- 17 November 2022 - 4pm-7pm
