The golf experience day was to offer Key Stage 4 students a chance to discover a new sport in PE that they can enjoy and be encouraged to try golf again outside of school and later on in life. Local driving ranges and golf courses are not as expensive as you might think and it is a form of physical activity with fantastic social aspects.

Oliver in Year 10 said, "I enjoyed participating in a different and new sport I haven't tried in PE before but what I enjoyed most was having fun with my friends and how informal it could be. It was really fun."

The PE curriculum aim at Key Stage 4 is to encourage students to participate in full context sports as well as other activities such as gym-based exercise, fitness classes and outdoor pursuits so that they are equipped to carry on exercising in their adult life. Adding golf to this experience is something the department wants to continue with as part of their "discovery lessons".
