Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Year 10 Parent View

As you will recall, we recently asked for Year 10 parents to provide feedback via our annual parent survey. The feedback from all stakeholders is essential as it informs our strategic planning and provides us with vital evidence of the impact of the work being undertaken throughout the school.

Over 90% of our families attended on the evening and a number responded to the survey either on the night or in the following days. We are grateful to all parents and carers that took the time to provide their feedback, a summary of findings from which are below. We have also attempted to respond to some of the queries and where appropriate individual contact has been made with parents.

1. My child is happy at this school.	93% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
2. My child feels safe at Hungerhill	98% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved	83% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with it quickly and effectively	Reassuringly most responses indicating that their child had not experienced any form of bullying at school. However, where it was indicated bullying had occurred, only four responses 'strongly disagreed' that the matter had dealt with quickly and effectively and these parents have been approached to discuss this matter further.
5. I am aware of what my child will learn during the year	93% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly	Of the respondents who stated they had raised a concern, three felt that the matter had not been dealt with properly. Again we have reached out to these parents to discuss this matter further and will amend our practice if required.
7. My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed	Of the respondents of parents of a child with a SEND, only one parent strongly disagreed that the school doesn't provide appropriate support
8. The school has high expectations of my child	88% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
9. My child does well at Hungerhill	93% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
10. I am aware of how well my child is doing	98% responded Agree or Strongly Agree



11. There is a range of subjects available to my child at Hungerhill	90% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
12. My child can take part in clubs and activities at Hungerhill	93% responded Agree or Strongly Agree
13. Hungerhill supports my child's wider personal development.	88% responded Agree or Strongly Agree

Further comments and follow up:

The survey provided the opportunity for parents to elaborate on their answers if they wished to do so.

Below is a sample of the **positive comments**, which as ever are greatly appreciated and have understandably been well received by staff.

“Parent's Evening was very clear tonight with staff having a breakdown of exam content to show areas where students need to improve.”

“i believe the school tries to be open and treat the pupils with respect and have found the teaching staff candid with their comments.”

“My child loves school life and has fully emersed himself in everything the school has to offer. Thanks to all staff for their hard work and dedication to the students.”

“The school is such a fantastic learning place, and the teachers that we met were very professional and I can see that they care and are truly committed to delivering good education for the children in the school.”

“My husband and I were really impressed with our daughter’s teachers. They were passionate, enthusiastic and professional. As a parent we felt reassured that they would go out of their way for my daughter to support her learning and also make her feel comfortable in their lessons.”

Additionally, the evening presented an opportunity for parents to share constructive comments that the senior leadership team and Ms Archibald have welcomed and have already acted upon. This has included a number of meetings with parents and telephone conversations to address any concerns raised. 


