

Trust Pledges

Our Brighter Futures Learning Partnership Trust (BFLPT) Pledges were co-created with our schools to support the holistic development of every child. We aim for our students to graduate with the knowledge, confidence, and skills needed for success, so they can access high-quality careers and achieve their dreams.

We hold high expectations for behaviour, focusing on good manners, reliability, and punctuality. Our students are encouraged to embrace the pledges, which extend learning beyond the classroom, broadening their experiences and helping them become active citizens. These pledges ensure every young person enjoys equal opportunities for a rewarding, fulfilling life.

Our Pledges:

- Through these pledges, students will actively participate, lead by example, and commit to serving others.
- Fully participate in school/UTC life by taking on leadership roles, making a difference to peers, leading initiatives like ECO schools, reading groups, or debates, or serving as an ambassador. This could also include learning to ride a bike or leading a healthy school initiative.
- Take part in at least three assemblies or help organise tutor activities or key events. Engage in community projects or activities.
- Attend an experience or visit that extends beyond the curriculum, outside of the familiar context or Doncaster.
- Participate in or watch a professional performance, contribute behind the scenes in a school production, or engage in performing arts to deepen cultural appreciation.
- Advocate for the environment through activities like litter picks, improving the school environment, organising recycling schemes, or leading a gardening project.
- Plan and lead a student-driven fundraising event.
- Represent the Trust in a sporting, cultural, or academic event.
- Take part in a residential trip, either at home or internationally.
- Visit a place of significant cultural difference within the UK.
- Participate in a formal presentation, such as performing a group dance, reciting poetry, or playing a musical instrument in an assembly.
- Be enterprising by selling something you've made, running a school shop, raising money for charity, or participating in service outside school like scouts or cadets.
