“The foodbank was there when we really needed it, it was an absolute lifeline.”

We don't think anyone in our community should have to face going hungry. That's why we provide three days' nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people who are referred to us in crisis. We are part of a nationwide network of foodbanks, supported by The Trussell Trust, working to combat poverty and hunger across the UK.

Our foodbank works with a number of different agencies, such as Citizens Advice, Mental health services, Housing support services, Employment advisors and Health visitors. To find out more about the agencies that hold our vouchers and how you can get help, please [contact us](#).

When you visit a referral agency they will take some basic details from you to complete the voucher. This will help them to identify the cause of your crisis and offer practical guidance. It also means we are able to prepare suitable emergency food for the right number of people.

Once you have been issued with a voucher, you can exchange this for a minimum of three days of [emergency food](#) at any of our [foodbank centres](#).

Here are the opening times and locations for our foodbank centres. Everyone who comes to the foodbank for emergency food needs to have a valid foodbank voucher.

Please remember to bring ID when you attend one of our foodbank centres.

Please be aware that our centres are closed on Bank Holidays.

What is Early Help?

Early Help is a way of thinking and working together as services with families that have **additional or more complex needs**.

It's for children and young people of any age and their family. Help can come from all kinds of services and organisations who work together to support your family. You might be using some of these services already, but we want to make sure they are providing the right support for you and your family's needs.

It could be that you're worried about your child's health, development or behaviour, or perhaps because you are caring for a disabled child.

Maybe you, your child or your whole family are affected by relationships within the family, drugs or alcohol or you are experiencing personal distress or anxiety, financial or housing problems.

By getting help from the right services at the right time, and as early as possible, we can help prevent or reduce potential problems for children as they grow up.
